#### **Description:**

This course is specific to train personnel on advanced applications of ICS during major statewide catastrophic events.

#### **Objectives include:**

- Describe how Unified Command functions on a multi-jurisdiction multi-agency incident.
- Define the advantages of the Unified Command and the kinds of situations which may call for it.
- List the major steps involved in the planning process.
- Dissect issues that influence incident complexity and the tools available to analyze complexity.
- Review the primary guidelines and responsibilities of the command and general staff positions.
- Describe the purposes and responsibilities of agency representatives or technical specialists, reporting relationships and how they can be effectively used within the incident organization.

#### **Target Audience:**

Personnel who will serve as Command or General Staff during a statewide catastrophic event. This may include select department heads with multi-agency coordination system responsibilities, area commanders, agency administrators, emergency managers, and Multi-Agency Coordination System/Emergency Operations Center managers.

#### **Cost:**

- There is NO cost to attend this course.
- Lodging, travel, and meals are the responsibility of the participant.

#### **Notes:**

- Participants who attend all hours required of this course and successfully pass a final exam will receive a Certificate of Completion.
- This course meets NIMS Baseline Training requirements for ICS 400.
